Brief Event Information

Organizer : The Hong Kong Award for Young People (AYP)

Nature of Event : Long distance cross-country navigation team competition, scoring event

Objectives :

- To raise funds for AYP, a charitable organization;
- To provide a thrilling event in which participants can enhance and develop skills in relation to planning, judgment, team-working and cultivates perseverance;
- To promote awareness to appreciation and protection of natural environment.

Venue : New Territories North

Type of Event : Scoring

Classes : Total 10 classes

6 hours event (Senior):	Male (SM6), Female (SW6), Mixed (SX6)
6 hours event (Youth):	Male (YM6), Female (YW6), Mixed (YX6)
Other 6 hours events:	AYP (AYP), Corporate (CORP)
3 hours event:	Come and Try It (CATI) & Family (FAMY)

Team Composition :

- All teams must be in 2-4 members.
- All participants must be aged 14 or above (as at 1st January 2019)
- Participants must have basic map-reading, navigation skill and good physical fitness.

6 hours event (Senior): (SM6, SW6, SX6)	<u>Local</u> 2-4 members, single or mixed gender depends on the class, all members aged 21 or above. <u>Overseas</u> 2-4 members, single or mixed gender depends on the class, all team members aged 21 or above and obtain overseas passport.
6 hours event (Youth): (YM6, YW6, YX6)	2-4 members, single or mixed gender depends on the class, all members aged 14 to 20.
6 hours event: AYP (AYP)	2-4 members, no gender requirement, for AYP OAs teams only. One of the team members must be aged 21 or above.
6 hours event: Corporate (CORP)	2-4 members, all team members should come from the same corporate / company. By invitation only.
3 hours event: Come And Try It (CATI)	2-4 members, all team members should have never won any awards in Rogaine competitions.
3 hours event: Family (FAMY)	2-4 members, must be composed of parent and children aged 6 or above.
6 hours event (Senior): (SM6, SW6, SX6)	<u>Local</u> 2-4 members, single or mixed gender depends on the class, all members aged 21 or above. <u>Overseas</u> 2-4 members, single or mixed gender depends on the class, all team members aged 21 or above and obtain

	overseas passport.
6 hours event (Youth): (YM6, YW6, YX6)	2-4 members, single or mixed gender depends on the class, all members aged 14 to 20.
6 hours event: AYP (AYP)	2-4 members, no gender requirement, for AYP OAs teams only. One of the team members must be aged 21 or above.

Expected no. of Participants : 1200pax. (1000 competitors; 200 volunteers & staff)

Accumulated Participation : 9400 pax.

Class Awards : The best three teams in each class will be awarded with medals and prizes.

Special Cups & Projects : 6 hours event Senior Challenge Cups – awarded to the best team in each senior class of 6 hours event.

6 hours event Youth Challenge Cups – awarded to the best team in each youth class of 6 hours event.

AYP Chairman Cup – awarded to **AYP** OAs with highest ranking in the 6 hours classes.

Corporate Team Championship – awarded to the best 3 teams in CORP class.

Project Star Trek Award – specially support the under-privileged and disabled youths to join in the CATI class. Teams completing the challenge will receive awards as recognition.

AYP - Facts

- In 1956, HRH Prince Philip established The Duke of Edinburgh's Award. Mr. George Stokes brought it to Hong Kong in 1961.
- It gives young people aged between 14 and 24, whether able-bodied or with special needs, an opportunity to experience challenge and adventure, acquire new skills and make new friends. It fosters self-discipline, enterprise and perseverance.
- There are three levels of Award: Bronze, Silver and Gold, each has an increasing degree of commitment.
- To gain any of these levels, each young entrant must complete four Sections: Expeditions/Explorations; Skills; Physical Recreation and Service. For Gold, participants must also complete a Residential Project, for at least five days.
- The Award Council licenses organizations to run the Scheme as Operating Authorities. Currently, we have over 700 User Units, including youth organizations, government departments, uniform groups,

schools and special schools.

- Accumulated total **Awards gained** in Hong Kong since 1961 as at June 2018 — **Gold** : 3,316, **Silver** : 23,069, **Bronze** : 53,124
- **International development:** At present, there are about 140 countries/cities operating the Award with over 890,000 participants worldwide.
- On 1 April 1997, the Award was renamed as ***The Hong Kong Award for Young People***.
- **Social Recognition:** AYP programme is recognized as one of the high-quality options of “Other Learning Experience” under the curriculum reform by the Education Bureau in 2009.
- At present, there are 24 members in the Award Council with Mr. LO Yan Lai, JP as the Chairman. All members were appointed by the Chief Executive of the HKSAR.
